 **Rob Moutrie** is a Policy Advocate for the **California Chamber of Commerce**. He lobbies on workplace safety issues, both at the legislature and at Cal/OSHA. Rob was one of the primary industry-side negotiators involved in California's COVID-19 emergency regulation, as well as California's wildfire smoke emergency regulation and others. Most recently, he was the lead industry negotiator on Senate Bill 553, which requires a workplace violence safety plan for virtually all California employers and went into effect in July 2024.



**Ashley Hoffman** is a Senior Policy Advocate for the **California Chamber of Commerce**. She specializes in labor and employment and workers' compensation issues. Before joining the CalChamber policy team, she was an associate attorney in the Sacramento office of a national law firm, representing employers in civil litigation and administrative matters as well as advising employers on best practices, including compliance with laws such as the California Labor Code, California Wage Orders, and the Fair Employment and Housing Act.
